 - A. TRAINING TOPIC - DISCUSSION AND REVIEW
 1. For the combination format of Workover/Completion with Well Servicing; certifications should be issued as Supervisor Level Certification for Workover/Completion only and Introductory Level Certification for Well Servicing.
 2. Supervisor and Fundamental Level Well Servicing Courses should be Stand-Alone Course curriculum.
 3. The Snubbing curriculum is currently available as a 20 hour course therefore it qualifies as a stand-alone course for supervisor/fundamental level.
 4. The Coiled Tubing curriculum is currently available as a 36 hour course and qualifies as a stand-alone course for supervisor/fundamental level. WCS is currently offering this course.
 5. The Wireline curriculum is currently available as a 16 hour course and also qualifies as a stand-alone course for supervisor/fundamental level.
 6. The concerns we have are in delivering a combination Workover/Completion, Well Servicing course format whereby the learner will only receive only 8 hours of instruction for the Coiled Tubing section while the snubbing and wireline will provide only 5 hours instruction time each respectively in accordance with IADC guidelines. We think that this is a major gap in training within the competency-based training guidelines currently approved and delivered to the industry. This type of certification should be reviewed with an emphasis on additional training for higher level certifications.

2. Standardization of BOP requirements industry-wide.

B. Hydraulic Fracturing/Stimulation (Don Hickman)

1. Need for more operational training.
2. Workover/Completion WellCAP Curriculum addresses well control competency-based training for this service.

VI. Action Items/Recommendations

A. Barry Cooper will present in the upcoming IADC Well Control Committee consideration for the following items from the IADC Well Servicing Committee.

1. Training Topic

- a. Supervisor Level WellCAP Certifications for stand-alone, expanded courses in Coiled Tubing, Snubbing and Wireline.
- b. Fundamental Level WellCAP Certifications for any combination of Coiled Tubing, Snubbing and Wireline with Workover/Completion Course.

2. Terminology Clarification

- a. Well Servicing terminology refers to Workover/Completion, Coiled Tubing, Snubbing, Wireline services, i.e., well services in a cased-hole environment.
- b. Workover/Completion services alone terminology refers to only Pulling Units.
- c. Production Services terminology refers to any or all Coiled Tubing, Snubbing and Wireline services.

B. Kenny Jordan will address BOP Industry Standardization with the following organizations in support of a minimum industry standard.

- a. API
- b. IPAA

VI. Set date for next meeting - Barry Cooper

A. The next meeting date will be scheduled by Joe Eustace and possibly aligned closely with the next scheduled IADC Well Control Committee Meeting in May. The Well Control Committee has not set a firm date for their meeting at this time.
