Minutes:

IADC Well Servicing Committee Chairman Joe Eustace opened the meeting and welcomed the attendees.

Holly Shock reviewed the IADC Antitrust Policy. The complete policy is posted at www.iadc.org/antitrust.htm.

Next, Mike Killalea reviewed the results of the IADC/AESC Survey on Well Control Training for Workover/Well Servicing Contractors. In the ensuing discussion, Brenda Kelly noted that the snubbing curriculum is currently under review by the IADC Well Control Committee.

The committee decided to delve more deeply into the survey results and to follow up on individual responses. Mike Killalea will supply the details of the survey to the Well Servicing Training Subcommittee.

Brenda Kelly suggested that a joint working group of the Well Control and Well Servicing Committees be organized to enhance the workover/well servicing curriculum. She said that the WC Committee had set improving the drilling curriculum as its priority, but that a joint work group would move the workover/well servicing agenda forward more quickly.

Then the committee reviewed the article on using GPS to enhance driver safety. The article, with some minor revisions, will be supplied to Maggie Cox and published in an upcoming edition of *Drilling Contractor*.

Mr. Eustace said that the WellCAP project should be pursued, and that it is an important project that will reap significant benefits for the industry.

Next was a discussion of leadership succession. Mr. Eustace asked whether any others would care to serve as chairman. The committee strongly endorsed Mr. Eustace for a second term. He was nominated, and the nomination was seconded and approved unanimously.

The next meeting was set for 10:30 am Tuesday, 18 May. There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
