

Fraudulent Check Warning

IADC has recently become aware that one or more individuals are attempting to make fraudulent purchases, typically by mail, using counterfeited checks imprinted with IADC's name and logo.

To date, IADC is aware of two instances in which an individual, using the name Jennifer and possibly located in the Los Angeles area, has attempted to make purchases in response to Internet advertisements for the sale of horses, using these counterfeited checks. Although the checks have IADC's name and logo on them, they do not include IADC's bank account numbers. **Individuals accepting such checks do so at their own risk. Checks bearing the IADC logo and contact information, and that are drawn on account number 2000030366495, are fraudulent.**

IADC has notified its bank about the existence of these fraudulent checks, and law enforcement authorities are attempting to trace the perpetrators.

IADC does not purchase products or services unrelated to its purpose of promoting the drilling contracting industry. When IADC makes purchases, it does so through individuals who identify themselves as acting for IADC. If you unexpectedly receive a check imprinted with the name and/or logo of the International Association of Drilling Contractors, without having sold any product or service to IADC, please contact Dean Gant immediately, at +1.713.292.1945.
